

# LOWFIELD PRIMARY SCHOOL SPORTS FUNDING ACTION PLAN 2015 / 2016

**Budget – School Sports Premium Funding = £8995**

**Vision:** ALL pupils leaving primary school **physically literate** and with the **knowledge, skills and motivation** necessary to equip them for a **healthy, active lifestyle** and **lifelong participation** in physical activity and sport.

**Objective:** To achieve **self-sustaining** improvement in the quality of PE and sport in primary schools against 5 key indicators:

- 1.the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles
- 2.the profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
- 3.increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- 4.broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- 5.increased participation in competitive sport
